Our guest speaker will be **Dave Gillespie** from Saskatoon. Dave has extensive flying experience including acrobatic competition and some air show performances. Over the past summer his adventures included a rare opportunity to fly a Spitfire in England.

Dave has owned a variety of certified and amateur built aircraft over the years. Of special note are a DE Havilland Chipmunk and a Pitts

Special which are significant aircraft in Canadian aviation. The Chipmunk was the 11th built and is the oldest flying Chipmunk in the world. The Pitts Special is the last remaining original aircraft of Canada's Carling Red Cap aerobatic team and its successors, the Canadian Reds and the Ray Ban Golds. These were Canada's only civilian aerobatic teams. Dave donated the Pitts Special to the Canadian Aviation Museum where it is currently on display.
